Described below are the items constituting the engineer's report to be discussed at your scheduled November 2024 meeting.

**2023-24 Subventions Claim:** Your claim was submitted to DWR for review, see attached summary content. Your claim is for \$153,761.78. After a \$1,000 per mile deduction (\$5,370), and assuming a full 75% reimbursement, the District should receive \$111,293 if there are no adjustments made by DWR. The Claim includes FEMA eligible items, as supplemental information in case FEMA rejects any items submitted.

#### **Fall-Winter 2024 Activities:**

- 1) Erosion Monitoring: See attached map of erosion locations on the Cache Slough Levee. Of the 14 sites, it has been confirmed that there are no possible animal burrows locations identified, and 2 of the most critical sites have been addressed in the recent repair project. There are still 3 sites to monitor this winter that could require temporary plastic and sandbags to protect.
- 2) Animal Control: Continue to patrol for rodent/beaver activity, potential burrow locations will be staked for observations. Animal activity impacting levee embankments can cause rapid changes in conditions that could lead to a levee embankment failure
- 3) Flood Season Preparation: A meeting should be scheduled with the land management team, District General Manager and District Engineer to review emergency operation plan, slow-rise checklist and confirm general availability this flood season for coverage. A draft emergency flowchart is attached to support initial coordination.

**Levee Maintenance Project Completion:** Asta Construction completed the levee maintenance project to construct a seepage berm between stations 215+00-220+00 and a setback levee with a flattened waterside slope between station 255+00-258+00. This project came in under the \$320,000 budget (Approximately \$300K construction cost), and also allowed for additional erosion repair and gravel roadway maintenance. The general cost savings was due to the reduction of fill quantity required to construct the project; roughly 4,000 tons less than estimated.

Attached is the Extra Work Authorization Proposal from Asta Construction showing the general change in costs. See photos below in the report; additional details will be provided with the Final Review/Payment Recommendation later in November once we receive the final invoice.

Due to our CDFW RMA limitations for waterside erosion repairs, the Project was only able to fully protect a 100-foot section of waterside slope at the main erosion/setback site. There is approximately 25 feet upstream and downstream of this main repair that has bare slopes for the time being. These slopes can be wrapped in plastic with Rock and sandbags holding the plastic down temporarily. Once the RMA work window opens again next year these sites can be rocked. Alternatively, this work could be done under an emergency, if needed this winter, although not ideal.

**FEMA/OES Coordination:** We continue to monitor the Grants Portal. The CAT D project has moved through the EHP review and is now in Final FEMA Review, which appears to be a management review level.

**Victoria Island Levee Failure – October 2024:** Reclamation District No. 2040, Victoria Island suffered a massive levee failure mid October; a 200+ foot section of levee cracked and slumped 5-6 feet vertically, overnight, and the levee started seeping rapidly through the failed embankment at about 6,000 GPM. This levee would have breached within the day if the District did not immediately begin flood fight procedures with the help of many local landowners, County support, Contractors and District Engineering forces.

Through significant effort, including waterside cutoff trenching and excavation, waterside emergency material banket (4-foot thick mixed material), landside ring levee construction, and reconstruction of the levee embankment, the District was able to suppress and complete a preliminary repair of the failed levee segment. The District is continuing to investigate (geotechnical investigations including CPT rig) potential causes for the levee failure. The location of the failure is near the confluence of the Old-Middle River dredge cuts on Victoria Island. It was determined that this location is where there is a remnant 600-foot wide channel meander with sand deposits at least to a depth of 26-feet. While this sand lens does not by itself create the failure, old channels are weak spots in levees, and change in condition due to waterside channel scour, rodent activity, landside farming operational changes, aging embankment materials, high tidal fluctuations, abandoned buried pipe failure, can lead to rapid changes in conditions within an embankment.

This is a SIGNIFICANT event in the Delta, and an important reminder to STAY VIGILANT. The takeaway from this example of a levee failure is to stay focused on routine maintenance and levee inspections/patrols. Annually evaluate the flood control and drainage system for weak links, and have plan to not only repair identified issues, but also operate under emergency conditions that could present themselves at any time.


**DPIIC October 28 Meeting on the Importance of Levees**: The DSC Delta Plan Interagency Implementation Committee met on October 28 with Delta levee stakeholders to discuss the importance of the levee system in the Delta and the science that needs to be incorporated moving forward to ensure levee integrity is included in future efforts by DSC. The Implementation Committee has limited Delta Specific experience, so one takeaway is to provide access and education opportunities for council and committee members to better educate them on the actual Delta and Levee system.


# TOP OF CONSERVATION CONDITIONS:






